Jim Hagman

Hunter/Equitation Clinician

For more than a quarter of a century, Jim's training and coaching excellence has played a role in a long list of successful riders including top placings and wins at the most successful competitions in North America, from Spruce Meadows in Calgary Alberta, Canada to the prestigious ASPCA Maclay National Medal Finals, champion hunters at the competitive indoor shows including Washington International Horse Show, Pennsylvania National Horse Shows and the United States Equestrian Federation National Pony Hunter and Equitation Finals along with numerous wins and championships.

As an excellent communicator, Jim's systematic teaching emphasizes the art of communication between the horse and the rider. His teaching style is positive and enthusiastic, with an emphasis on building confidence and tact. With an extensive and varied horsemanship background from Western to dressage, Jim has been taught and mentored by some of the world's elite traditional and professional horsemen. He has a working relationship with many of the elite coaches and trainers in North America as well as in Europe and Latin America.

Callan Solem

Jumper Clinician

Callan Solem has competed in 8 Nation's Cup competitions and competed for the United States a dozen times across the world, over decades. In 2015, she was 3rd place in the \$1 million Grand Prix before going on to win the Nation's Cup in Xalapa, securing the US's place in the Finals in Barcelona. In 2016, she was the highest placed American and highest placed woman in the World Cup Finals, in 7th place, in Gothenburg, Sweden and part of the second place Nations Cup team in Rome, Italy. This achievement put her in the short list for the Olympic Games in Rio as well. She was leading rider at Live Oak International and the National Horse Show, as well as Style of Riding awards at Devon. Solem also has numerous championships in professional hunter divisions at top shows including the Hampton Classic, Devon, and Capital Challenge. She was the reserve rider in the Medal Finals at Harrisburg in '96 and went on to judge the WIHS Equitation Finals in 2021. Solem's career earnings near \$3 million, making her one of the top competitors in the US ever.

Amy Center is a seasoned professional with a proven track record in training, coaching and fostering community involvement. Mrs. Center has owned and trained from her Cavallo Farms home base in Tallahassee, Florida for over thirty years. As a rider and a coach, Amy has seen many successes in all three rings and has represented at most major finals. Mrs. Center has had her judges license since 2016 and currently holds a USEF "R" license in Hunter, Equitation, and Jumpers and her FEI Level 1 Jumper Judge license. Amy now officiates across the country and Canada. Mrs. Center has also been the Chairman of the USHJA Emerging Athletes Program for the last four years and works with Olympic level clinicians to help "open eyes and open doors" for promising young athletes from across our Country, South America and Canada. Mrs. Center is also a USHJA Credentialed Instructor and works as an examiner for the program helping to promote and mentor instructors across the country in our discipline. Amy enjoys teaching when at home and offering clinics away from home. She focuses on correct and simple communication with the horse to achieve each rider's respective goals. Amy remains focused on the classic forward seat riding theories and horsemanship.

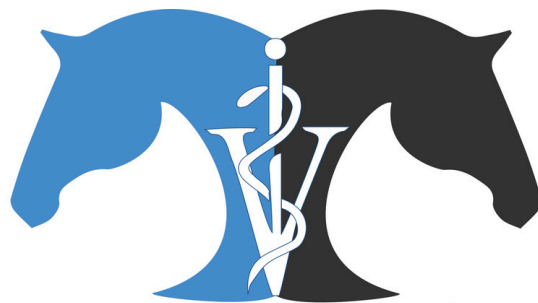



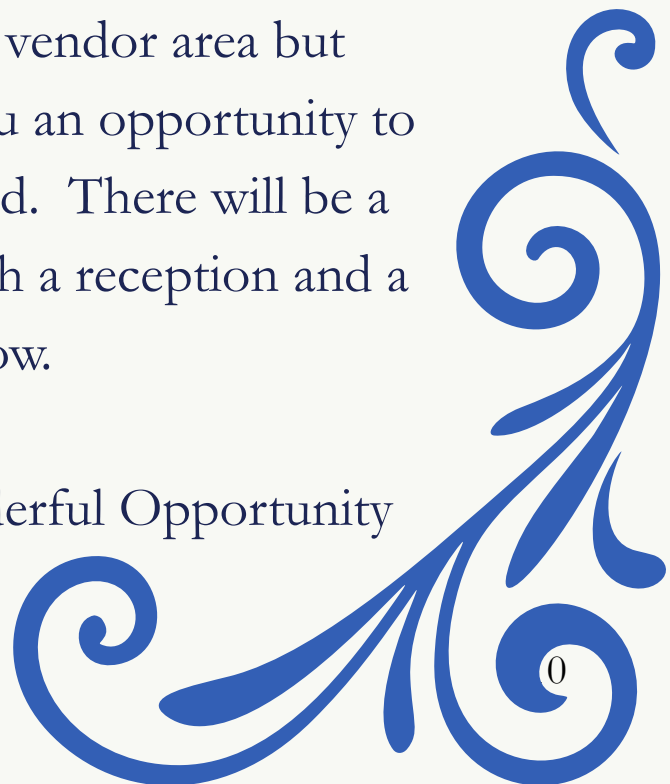


So many riders aspire to continue their horse careers and ride at College., but what does it really take? Find out!
